

# A Profile of VT PREP's 3rd Cycle

The 2016-17 academic year marked the end of our <u>3rd cycle</u>, which included our 11th - 14th Cohorts. A total of 29 trainees participated in our program (from 427 applications). Ttwenty six (89.7%) applied to and were admitted into PhD programs (as shown for each Cohort below). Twenty, or 77% continues in the PhD programs into which they matriculated. The success of the 3rd cycle has continued with our transition Cohort (14.5/15)since all four trainees have multiple invitations for interviews.
